

Robyn Carmichael's distinctive style has defined her concerts in the U.S. and abroad. Last season included concerts in Seattle, Portland, San Diego, San Francisco and the Bay Area. She has a CD release with music of Scarlatti, Mendelssohn, Chopin, Schumann, de Falla, Tchaikovsky, Bach-Alkan, and Rachmaninoff.

2018 features East and West Coast tours with all-Russian and all-Romantic programs, and educational concerts for libraries and grassroots organizations. Ms. Carmichael has toured Poland three times and appeared at the Aspen Music Festival, Glasgow's Grand Concert Hall, Warsaw's Ostrogski Palace Concert Hall, New York City's CAMI Hall, Poland's Radziejowice Palace, and Denver's Municipal Auditorium. www.robyncarmichael.com
